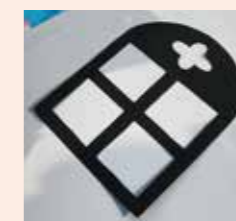
Nagasaki Prefecture's elementary and junior high school students will sing Christmas songs together.
